Our healthy streets:

Dulwich **Phase 3**



In **Phase 1** (Spring 2019): You told us you were worried about through traffic, road safety and air quality, particularly at the junction of Dulwich Village and Calton Avenue, and on Townley Road, streets used by thousands of school students every day.

In **Phase 2** (Autumn 2019): You told us you support area-wide measures to address concerns about through traffic on your streets. You wanted a permeable road closure at Calton Avenue, and measures to reduce traffic on Dulwich Village and Townley Road, so that residents and students can enjoy safer streets and healthier, more active travel.

In **Phase 3** (Spring 2020): We have developed area-wide proposals to encourage active travel and create healthy streets.

Area B:

Permeable road closure on Calton Avenue and Court Lane – no motor vehicles at any time. This will create a safer environment for walking and cycling and new community spaces to enjoy.

Timed restricted access on Townley Road, preventing through traffic at peak times and providing a safer, healthy street environment. Exemption will be considered for permitted traffic eg. residents, emergency services etc.

Permeable closure at Eynella Road to restrict through traffic and provide a new community space.

These proposals respond directly to resident feedback and our traffic reviews.

Areas A & C:

To make sure all local streets benefit from traffic reduction measures, we want to explore with you options for:

- Timed northbound restrictions on Dulwich Village and near its junction with Burbage Road
- Possible 'no entry' or closure on Burbage Road, Turney Road and Melbourne Grove, all roads which experience high levels of through traffic
- Possible parking controls for areas B & C
