

Names for Block G1:

Greendale Tarn



Greendale is a small lake and a hamlet in Cumbria. A fictionalised version of Greendale is where Postman Pat is based. Proposed name: **Greendale House**

Chestnut Hill



Chestnut Hill is a small suburb of the nearby Keswick. Located near the River Greta and not far from the large lake Derwentwater. Proposed name: **Chestnut Hill House**

Thornhill



A village to the South of Whitehaven with a population of 825. Created in the 1920s as part of a national campaign to improve housing conditions after WW1. Proposed name: **Thornhill House**

Names for Over 55s Block:

Eaglesfield



A small village near Cockermouth, with a population of 233. The birthplace of John Dalton who invented the Atomic Theory. Proposed name: **Eaglesfield House**

Greystoke



A small village of 654 people near Penrith. Home to Greystoke Castle on a site that has been fortified since the Norman Conquest. Proposed name: **Greystoke House**

Kendal



Kendal is a market town with a population of 28,944. Home of the famous Kendal Mint Cake and has its own local dialect called Kendalian. Proposed name: **Kendal House**

Names for Block C:

Hawksdale



Hawksdale is a hamlet near the river Caldew, not too far from Carlisle. Hawksdale House is grand country home located here that dates back to 1694. Proposed name: **Hawksdale House**

Moresby



Moresby is a village on Cumbria's West coast, with a population of 1,997. The site of a Roman fort called Gabrosentum. Proposed name: **Moresby House**

Hayeswater



Hayeswater is a small natural lake near the hamlet of Hartsop. It was damned and used as a reservoir from 1908, before being restored to a natural lake in 2014. Proposed name: **Hayeswater House**
